Arthur Stewart

Arthur began practicing law in Warren in 1985. In 1988 he purchased an oil and gas lease with 13 conventional wells, and as his oil and gas business grew Arthur retired from the practice of law. His oil and gas company, Cameron Energy, now has over 30 employees, operating 1100 conventional wells in NW PA. In 2006 he co-founded D & I Silica, a supplier of frac sand to the Marcellus and Utica. When D & I was sold in 2013 it was the largest independent supplier of frac sand in the East. In 2013 Arthur co-founded the PA Grade Crude Oil Coalition (PGCC) where he chairs the Legal Committee. The Legal Committee works on both federal and state issues and Arthur spends a number of days in Harrisburg and DC advocating for conventional oil and gas. Arthur is also a charter member of the PA Crude Oil Development Advisory Council (CDAC) where he serves as chairman. Arthur's company operates 6 service rigs and plugs about 25 abandoned and orphan wells per year.

Mike Hillebrand

Mike is a graduate of the Pennsylvania State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Petroleum and Natural Gas Engineering. He is an active member of the Society of Petroleum Engineers (SPE) and serves on several boards, including Huntley & Huntley, Inc. Huntley & Huntley Energy Exploration, LLC, Leviathan Energy, LLC, Bow & Arrow Land, LLC and the Pennsylvania Independent Oil and Gas Association. He has thirty-one years of combined experience in both vertical and horizontal well drilling, completions and operations as well as all managerial and financial aspects of oil and natural gas business development, acquisition and marketing. Mike started his career as a service company engineer for an international service company, which focused on cementing, stimulation and coiled tubing services for well construction. In 1990, Mike joined Power Gas Marketing and Transmission, a subsidiary of Sithe Energies, a large, independent, natural gas fired, power generation company. As Vice President of Business Development, he oversaw the drilling and/or acquisition of over 2,000 operated and non-operated properties within the Appalachian Basin. In 1998, Mike joined Huntley & Huntley as an equity partner. From 1998 through 2008 he raised over \$150 million through the creation and management of 26 private

placement memorandums and several joint venture programs that either drilled or participated in over 600 wells. Over 300 of these wells were constructed and made operational under Mike's direct supervision and oversite. In 2008, Mike lead Huntley through an industry transformation where horizontal well drilling technology replaced conventional vertical well drilling. Since 2012, Mike is directly responsible for the creation of Huntley & Huntley Energy Exploration, Huntley's Appalachian Basin Marcellus Shale Business, to which now owns the lasts undeveloped, 100,000 acres of tier one quality in SW PA and is just now starting its development.
